Language In Action is committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all of our students. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at our centres.

What is bullying?

Bullying is the use of aggression with the intention of hurting another person. Bullying results in pain and distress to the victim.

Bullying can be:

Emotional



Being unfriendly, excluding, tormenting (e.g. hiding books, threatening gestures)

Verbal



Name-calling, sarcasm, spreading rumors, teasing

Sexual



Unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments

Homophobic



Focusing on the issue of sexuality

Physical



Pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence

Racist



Racial taunts, graffiti, gestures

Cyber



All areas of internet, such as email & internet chat room misuse. Mobile threats by text messaging & calls. Misuse of associated technology, i.e. camera & video facilities
